And if he lets just one species to vanish it will put his own life at risk on the earth ultimately.

Human population is increasing year by year. Man wants to make his life more and more comfortable. Forests are being cut to get more land for agriculture so that enough food can be made available to the growing population.

It is important for man to realize the truth: man in spite of his genius cannot create a new species nor can he recreate one he has destroyed. It is time to be warned.
