Solution:

The Ministry Of Home Affairs deals with disaster management at the national level.

Relief Rehabilitation Department and the Department of disaster management deal with disasters at the state level.

At the district level the Office of the District Magistrate, at the block level the Office of Panchayat Samiti and at the village level the village disaster Management Committee deal with disaster management.

Question-2

What are the main functions of the District Disaster Management Committee?

Solution:

The District Disaster Management Committee prepares the District Disaster Management Plan for the State Administration. The committee trains members of the Disaster Management Team in rescue and relief

operations. The Committee carries out mock rescue drills as a preparation for disaster management.

Question-3

Write about disaster Management at the Village level.

Solution:

The village Disaster management committee is headed by the Village Sarpanch or the village headman. He prepares the Village Disaster Management Plan and coordinates with the various agencies during a disaster.

Question-4

Write about Disaster Management at the District level

Solution:

Government plans for disaster management are implemented by the District Administration.

The actual ground work for relief is the responsibility of the District Magistrate, the District Collector and the Deputy Commissioner. They coordinate and supervise the relief work. The District Disaster Management Committee is headed by the District Magistrate. Officers from the Health; Irrigation; Veterinary; Police; Fire Services and the Water and Sanitation departments are members of this committee.

The District Disaster Management Committee takes decisions on the relief measure and these decisions are carried out by the Disaster Management Team. Trained personnel from all the departments carry out the relief measures.

Solution:

The United Nations Disaster Management Team represents various UN agencies to implement preparedness and mitigation efforts and to strengthen the government's capacities on disaster management.

The UN General Assembly has appointed the UN Office for Coordination of Humanitarian Affairs to look into all International disaster responses.

The UNDMT- India has representations from various UN agencies like the FAO; ILO; UNICEF and WHO. When ever there is a disaster all these agencies act together.

The primary purpose of the UNDMT- India, is to ensure prompt, effective services during a disaster.

Question-6

What is the role of the Armed forces during a disaster?

Solution:

The Indian Armed Forces is the main entity the Government depends on during disasters. The Armed Forces enter the scene only when the local administration is not able to handle the situation.

The Armed Forces have always played a major role in emergency support functions like communications, search and rescue operations, health and
